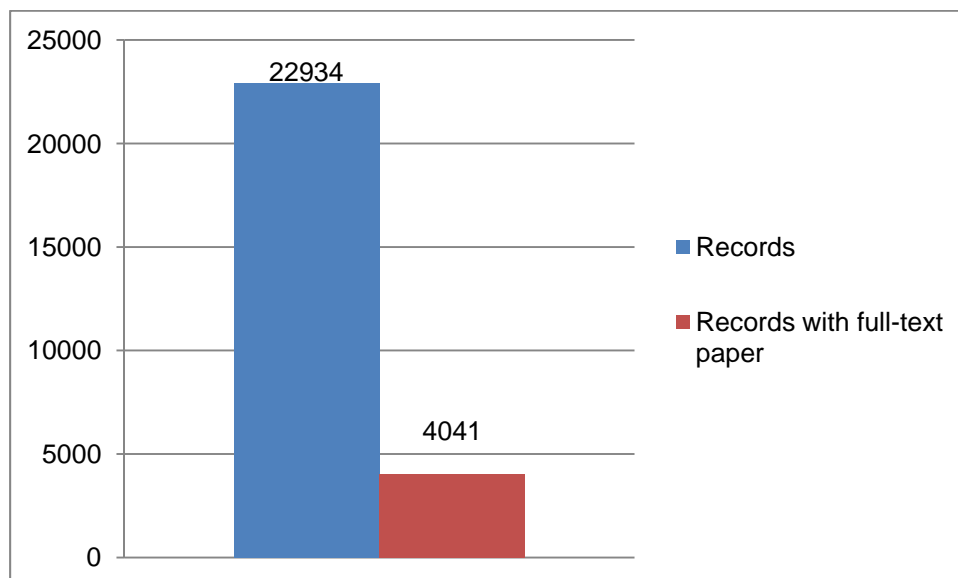

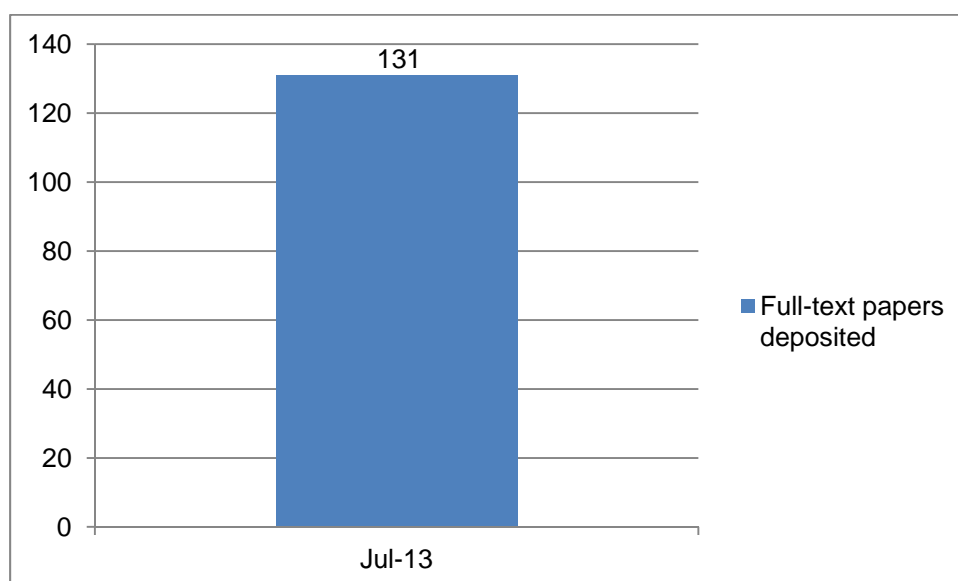

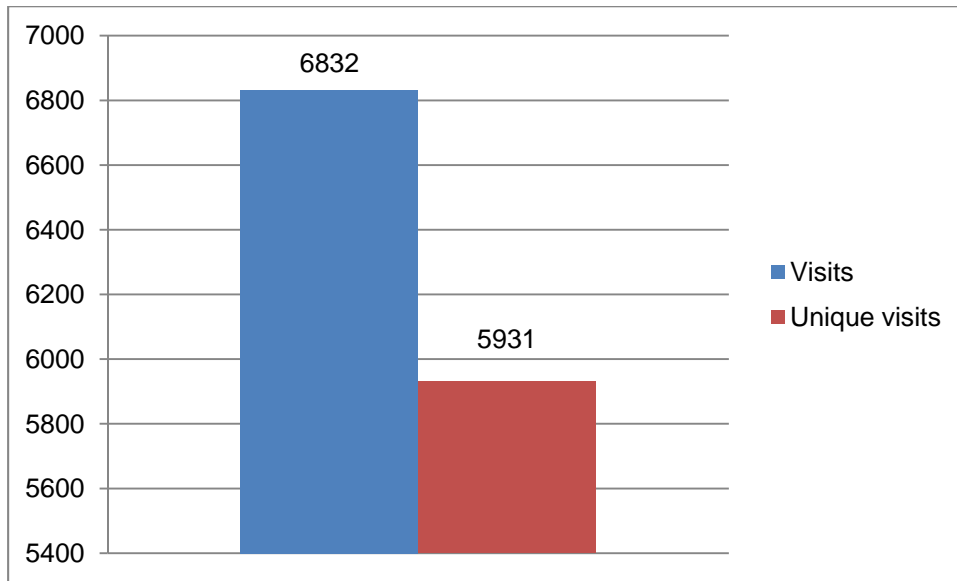
Total number of records in LSHTM Research Online at 31st July 2013



Number of full-text papers deposited in LSHTM Research Online during July 2013

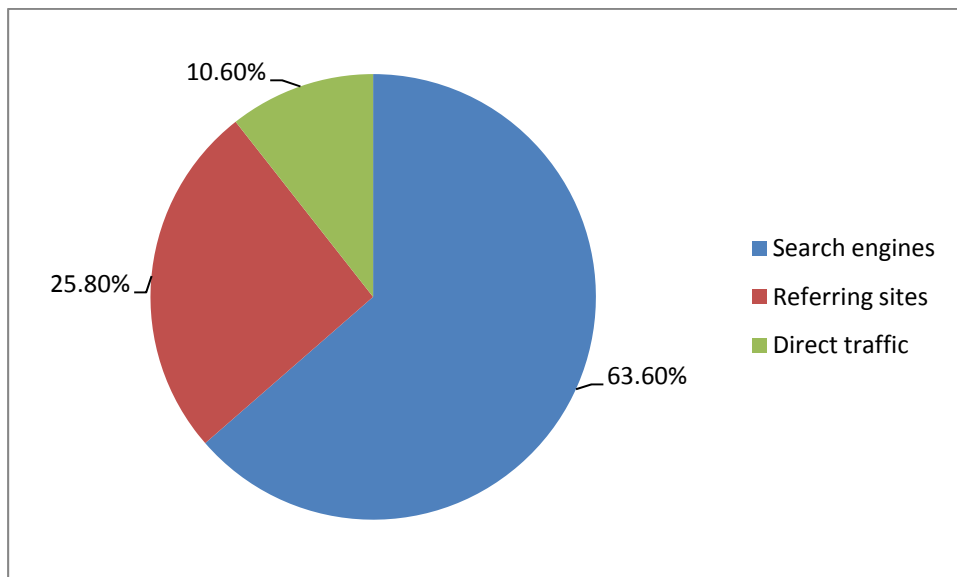


Visits to LSHTM Research Online during July 2013

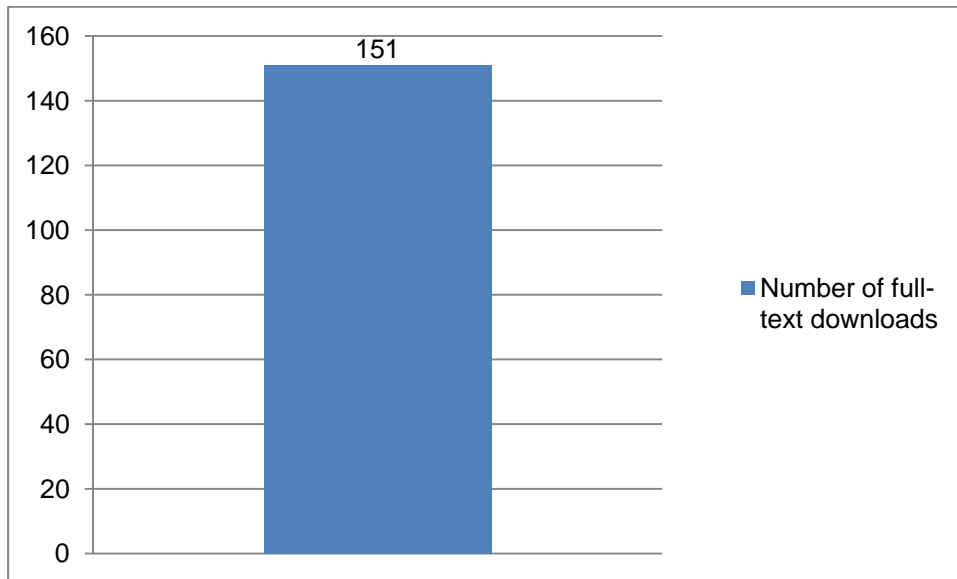
Traffic source definitions

Search engines: visitors coming via a search engine

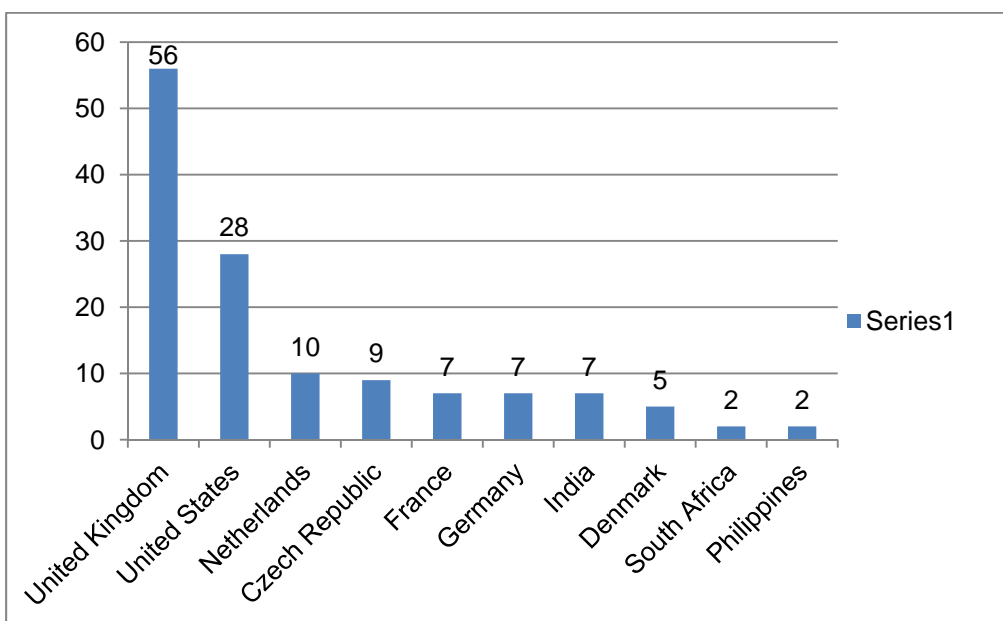
Referring sites: visitors referred by links on other websites
